Mr. Nakachi provides advice on matters having to do with the U.S. import laws administered by U.S. Customs and Border Protection and other federal government agencies. His practice includes customs law and its subordinate issues of classification, origin, marking, C-TPAT, valuation and transfer pricing, and he also frequently advocates for clients in response to unfavorable regulatory actions such as audits, seizures, detentions, redelivery notices, liquidated damages, civil penalties, etc. Mr. Nakachi is frequently consulted on the creation or improvement of compliance and regulatory programs, and he has assisted clients dealing with verifications under U.S. free trade agreements and preferential programs.

Mr. Nakachi provides counsel on other international legal matters such as the U.S. export control laws, the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, antidumping and countervailing duties, as well as a wide variety of other U.S. laws affecting international trade and transportation.
